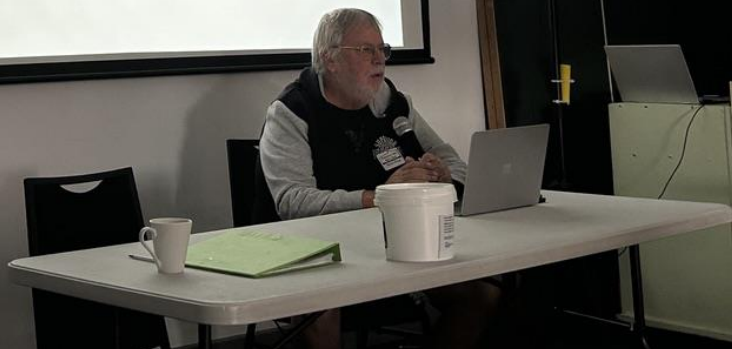
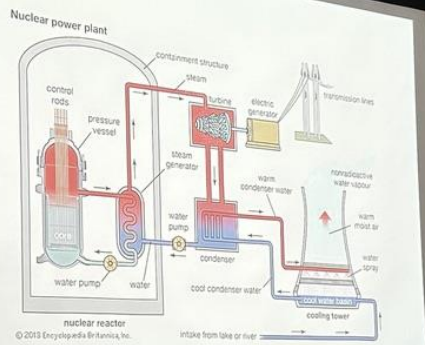
Nuclear Energy

Advantages

- No direct pollution with a small if any carbon footprint
- Fuel costs for nuclear plants are a minor proportion of total generating costs
- System costs for nuclear power (as well as coal and gas-fired generation) are very much lower than for intermittent renewables.
- Although higher initial construction and commissioning cost, cheaper costs in day to day operation.

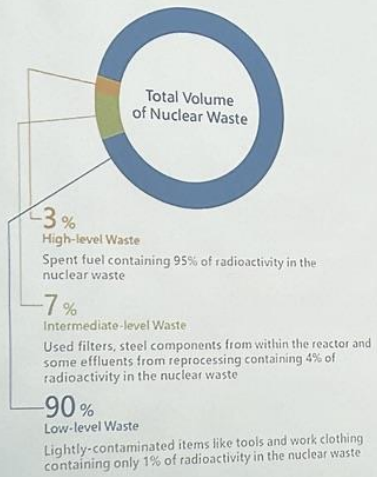


Basic Operation

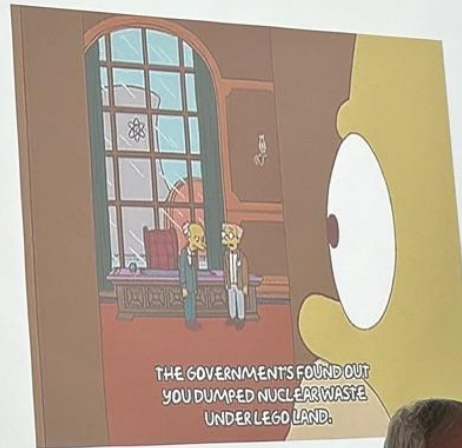

On average, the waste from a reactor supplying a person's electricity needs for a year would be about the size of a brick. Only 5 grams of this is high-level waste – about the same weight as a sheet of paper.

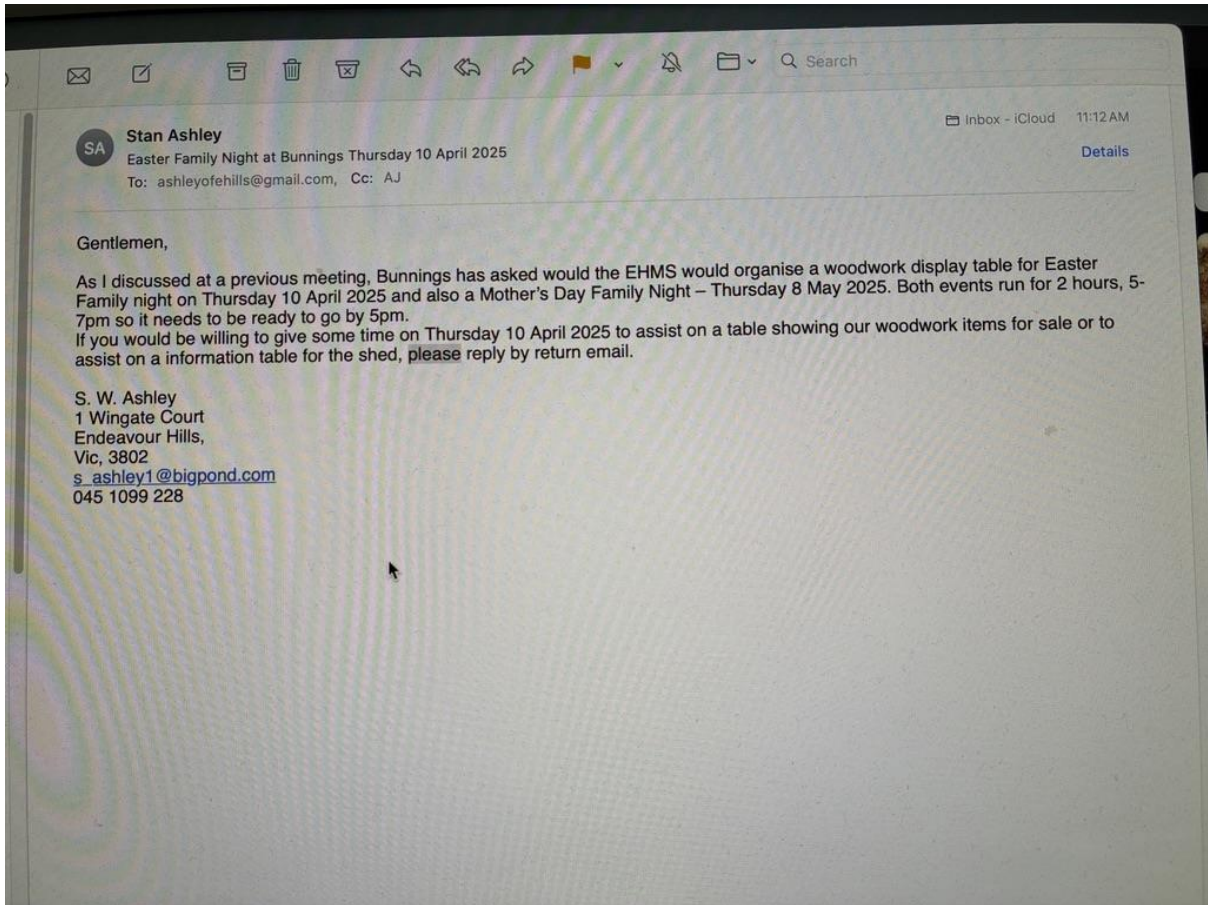
