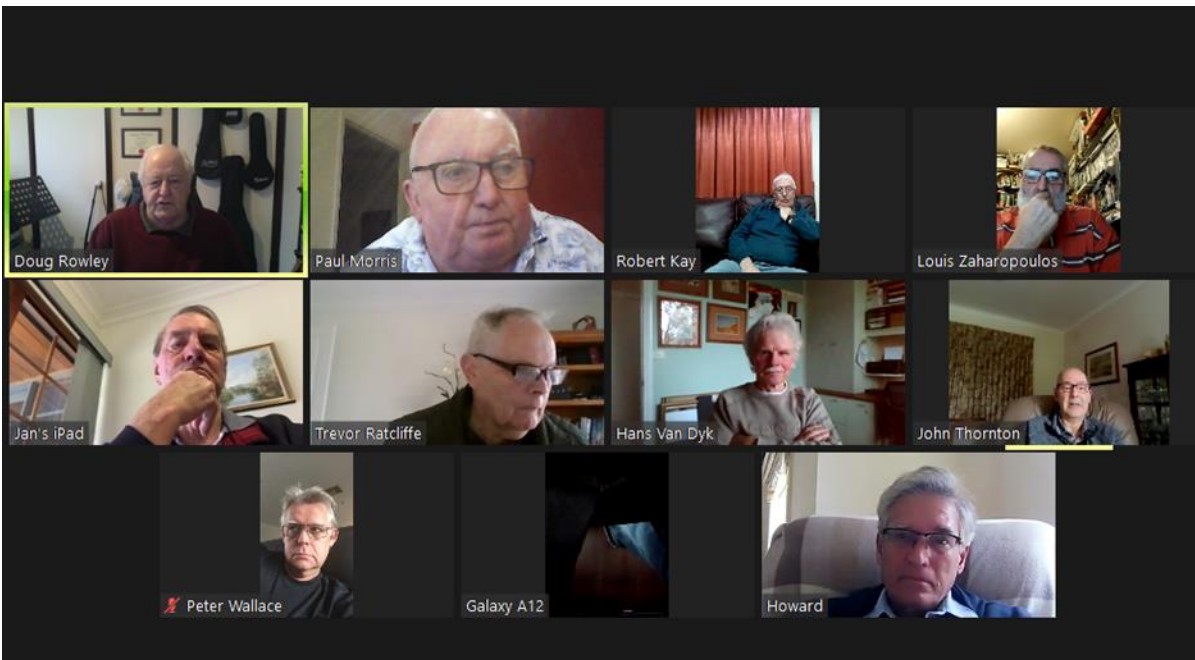


Men's Activities
