DOVETON SHOW – Sunday 18th September 2022

Just a few of things, these may impact our ability to volunteer on the day:

1. On arrival at Myuna Farm parking will be on the opposite side of Kidds Road – explain to the Ranger Scouts that you are volunteer, you should not have to pay unless you want to, be there no later than 9:20am as we have to register and then go to the gates.
2. There is no vehicular access to Myuna Farm on the day after “bump in” finishes at 8am, except for emergency vehicles. The internal car parks and driveway will be full of stalls, rides and entertainment. This means that you must be able to walk from the gate to the farm to register and then back again if you are on the gate. The table will be inside the pavilion which is a further 100 metres from the registration desk – this may prove impossible for John G – we’ll talk about this on Tuesday. We will also need to carry any goods we wish to sell and any info brochures, photos, etc from the car park – we may need to take a trolley, unless we bump in before 8am.
3. Lunches, drinks, etc will be available for volunteers from the signal box, about 50 metres beyond the registration.
4. Working With Children – a current WWC must be available when checking in – registration will be done on a web app or the desk staff will assist you. No WWC – no volunteer – Michelle (chairperson) was very insistent in this.
5. If you do not have WWC – you can apply online [here](#) – mobile phone required for photos. Graeme Seymour did it a couple of weeks ago and got his approval email the same day.
6. We will be provided with a lanyard and vest identifying us as a Volunteer.
7. It will not be a constant task, we should be able to have a wander, visit the animals, go on a ride (pay of course), just stretch your legs every now and then – maybe a sit down –bring your favourite folding chair with you – we will bring a few from the shed on the day.
8. Don’t forget a hat, sunglasses and sunscreen – the sun might shine if we are lucky.
9. Our job is to greet the public, welcome them to the show, count them and direct them to the “gold coin donation” bin – no tickets no enforcement required. There are ATMs on site near the Farm entrance building.
10. In case of difficulty there will be a few Police onsite and their site is near the main gate.
11. The Shed will get \$1000 for doing this.

We’ll go through all this on Tuesday.
