Congratulations Rom the gold cup will be presented next Tuesday, an expensive trophy donated by Rodney J.



AMAZING PIE RESULTS AT THURSDAY TASTING!

Well not really, but we've got your attention. The Thursday Naughty Boys program at the shed includes a light lunch prepared by the attending members in turn.

What happens when nobody volunteers?

The Great Pie Taste is held. Sixteen shedders devoured the provided pies which were cut up into quarters to give bite size portions and each tester was given 6 different pies to sample. The subjective criteria for judging were "scoffability" of a frozen meat pie of reasonable cost, one that you could scoff whilst holding a "coldie" in your other hand. Unfortunately, we did not provide coldies due to our contractual arrangements with the City of Casey. Oh well, we could always dream or remember! We gave the first pie which was the cheapest (Aldi Elmsbury 4pk @\$5 or \$1.25 per pie) an arbitrary rating of "5" and then each following pie, points against this benchmark.

All the pies were frozen, all were meat pies, all under \$4 per pie-so basic pies from the fridge, ready to heat and eat. Scoffability was the perception of the participants and not based on scientific measurement or research.

Of the 6 pies tasted our averages were:

- 1. Aldi Slow Cooked Chunky Sous @ \$3.25 ea. 6.53 score (best but dearest)
- 2. Aldi Elmsbury Chunky @ \$1.50ea. 5.6 score (best value for taste?)
- 3. Woolworths Home Brand @ \$1.37ea. 5.27 score.
- 4. Four and Twenty Meat @ \$2.25ea. 5.20 score (2nd dearest pie)
- 5. Aldi Elmsbury Meat @ \$1.25ea. 5 score (benchmark, cheapest pie)
- 6. Coles Home Brand Meat @ \$1.37ea. 4.80 score

The activity was a lot of fun but hard work for Wal who had to cut up 96 quarters and found that cutting a pie in half is easy but in half again, not so easy.

- 2. Best value pie Elmsbury chunky beef for \$6.00 or 4 for \$1.50 each.




